The newly constructed Djidbidjibi residential college responds to the community request to improve education and to improve school enrolment, engagement and attendance (by having Bininj students reside in Jabiru to provide easier access to schooling and to support their learning).

The Head of College will play a critical role in ensuring that the vision of the Gundjeihmi Aboriginal Corporation to "improve Indigenous education" is realised. They will work closely with the senior management and Learning and Effectiveness Team to develop and implement the groundbreaking learning and systems reforms that GAC is working towards.
